## The Reopening Roadmap

Where we are in Washington, D.C.

### Current Status

#### Phase 1

Museums & exhibits remain closed; parks, fields, tennis courts, tracks & golf courses open with safeguards. Curbside retail open, outdoor dining available with limitations, outdoor rentals available with limitations

#### Phase 2










Museums & exhibits open with limited capacity (5 people per 1,000 sq. ft.); non-essential retail with 50% capacity, indoor dining with 50% capacity; face coverings required where social distancing is not applicable

#### Phase 3

Museums can allow limited tours (10 people per 1,000 sq. ft.); outdoor events with up to 250 people; venues open with up to 250 people; all parks and recreation facilities open with safeguards

## The Reopening Roadmap

Where we are in Baltimore and National Harbor

### Phase 1

Baltimore and Prince George's County are currently not reopening; status of opening is based on what is approved by the state of Maryland

### Phase 2

Non-essential business is open with 50% capacity; personal services open with 50% capacity; Prince George's County and Montgomery County open; Baltimore City open; face coverings required where social distancing is not applicable















### Phase 3

Maryland is permitted to move into Phase 3. [Prince George's County moves into a modified Phase 2](#). [Baltimore City](#) is not moving into Phase 3, but loosened restrictions.

### Phase 1

Non-essential retail open with 50% capacity

### Phase 2

Non-essential retail open with 50% capacity, restaurants open indoor dining areas at 50% capacity; indoor recreation opens with 30% capacity; museums open with restrictions; outdoor concert venues open with 50%












**Current Status**

### Phase 3

Capacity lifted for retail, restaurants, and bars; entertainment venues at 50% or up to 1,000 people, social gatherings of 250; face coverings required where social distancing is not applicable
