Breakdown of the levels:

Protect your Neighbors:

Indoor – 50% capacity with add'l increased over time, 500 people and 6' distance.

Outdoor – per local zoning

Safer at Home Level 1 - Cautious:

Indoor - 50% capacity, 175 people with 6' between.

Safer at Home Level 2 - Concern:

Indoor - 50% capacity, 50 people (or up to 100 with calculator) and 6' between.

Outdoor – per local zoning

Stay at Home - High Risk:

Indoor and Outdoor – Take out or delivery only

	Large Ground Transportation	✓	Reduced operating schedule
	Hotels & Resorts	✓	Hotels were not ordered to close but closed at their own discretion. Hotels and resorts are permitted to reopen at their own discretion.

	Restaurants	✓	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Indoor dining permitted at 25% capacity or 50 patrons (whichever is lower) Outdoor dining: 6 ft. between parties per local zoning
	Bars and Breweries	✗	Closed
	Entertainment & Event venues	✓	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Indoor: 25% capacity or 50 people (whichever is lower) Outdoor: 25% capacity or 75 people (whichever is lower)
	Tours Operating	✓	Small individual groups for some activities such as fly fishing with social distancing. Outdoor guided services 25% or up to 10 people, whichever is less
	State & Local Parks	✓	Camping is allowed with reservations within counties that will allow it. Social distancing with groups suggested. Outdoor recreation permitted with limitations.
	State Venue	✗	All state venues are currently closed.
