Phase 1

Gatherings over 50 people are prohibited. Large venues (restaurants, theatres, sporting venues) begin to operate with appropriate physical distancing.

Phase 2

No gathering limitations on Restaurants, gyms, theaters, bars providing in-dine service
50 guests maximum per event









Phase 3

There are currently no COVID-19 restrictions. Some businesses have elected to remain close or modify hours. Business are also able to determine their own regulations.

	Tours Operating	✓	Hiking and biking tours are operating in small groups. Museums are starting to open.
	State & Local Parks	✓	Sabino Canyon and Madera Canyon are open.
